

NDBA Peewee Rep Rules

In Minor Peewee, Peewee, Minor Bantam, and Bantam, teams may elect to utilize an extra player (EP) in the starting line-up.

It is optional for teams to use an EP

The starting EP may bat anywhere in the batting order.

The option to use the EP must be declared when handing in the line-up card prior to the start of the game.

The EP will be considered a tenth starting position and is eligible to re-enter the game after having been substituted for (see [Re-Entry Rule](#))

If a team using the EP drops below 10 players due to injuries or ejections, the game shall continue with 9 players. The batting order will be shifted up to fill the void but otherwise remains the same.

A team that has declared their intention to use an EP prior to the game must continue to use an EP throughout the game, unless ejections or injuries leave the team with only 9 players. Once declared, the EP cannot be eliminated at the discretion of the coach or manager.

The EP may be put into a defensive position at any time. All 10 players listed in the batting order may be rotated among the 9 defensive positions at the discretion of the coach or manager.

EXAMPLE: The manager can move the EP into left field, and have the left fielder become the EP. This is not considered as a substitution, since the batting order is not affected and both players are remaining in the game. It is no different than switching the shortstop and left fielder. Switches such as this are unlimited.

If the player starting as the EP is moved into a defensive position, his place in the batting order does not change.

If a defensive player is removed from the game, the EP can assume that defensive position. In this case, the new player entering the game would become the EP, but would bat in the spot of the substituted defensive player.

Pitching and the Re-Entry Rule

A substituted starting pitcher may not re-enter to pitch

Any substituted starting player (other than the starting pitcher) may pitch upon re-entering the game, provided they did not previously pitch in that game.

In Peewee and below, players may not act as base coaches.
